THIS year marks the 120th anniversary of Durban's Natural Science Museum – and to commemorate the event a series of seminars will be

The first seminar was held by the museum's Research Centre and focussed on climate change.

Museum Director Guy Redman said global warming and climate change were two of the most pertinent issues at present, both for the city and internationally.

"Climate change provides a link between 120 years of history at the museum and our present and the future. We need to debate the questions: What was the climate then? What is it now? And what will it be like in 120 vears time?" he said.

Seminar

The opening seminar featured presentations by Dr Debra Roberts, Head of the municipality's Environmental Management Department and a force in imposing environmental management legislation and predicting the city's climatic future, and Dr Peter Goodman, co-ordinator of Biodiversity Research at Ezemvelo KZN Wildlife.

Goodman's talk, titled "Biodiversity Conservation Planonment", highlighted the role of conservation planning and implementation in KwaZulu-

The seminars, aimed at creating awareness of the important contributions that research collections, such as those housed at the Research Centre make towards science the monitoring of environmental change, are set to continue in June, September and November.

The seminars are free to the public.

THE 10th annual Time of the Writer festival in Durban draws to a close tomorrow after a week-long programme which has included talks and debate from some of South Africa and the continent's literary heavyweights.

The international festival, hosted by the University of KwaZulu-Natal's Centre for Creative Arts, featured 18 writers from 10 countries.

With its extensive programme of activities and a culturally diverse line-up of writers, it offered a valuable insight into the motivations and processes that inform the complex art of writing.

A special Human Rights Day slot was included in the programme. It was set to feature a reading of work by assassinated Russian journalist Anna Politkovskaya.

Also on the bill was a rare interview with one of the first black women to publish an English novel, Miriam Tlali; and a presentation by African literary giant Ngugi wa Thiongo'o, who was due to speak on the role of writers in spreading and strengthening human rights. 
